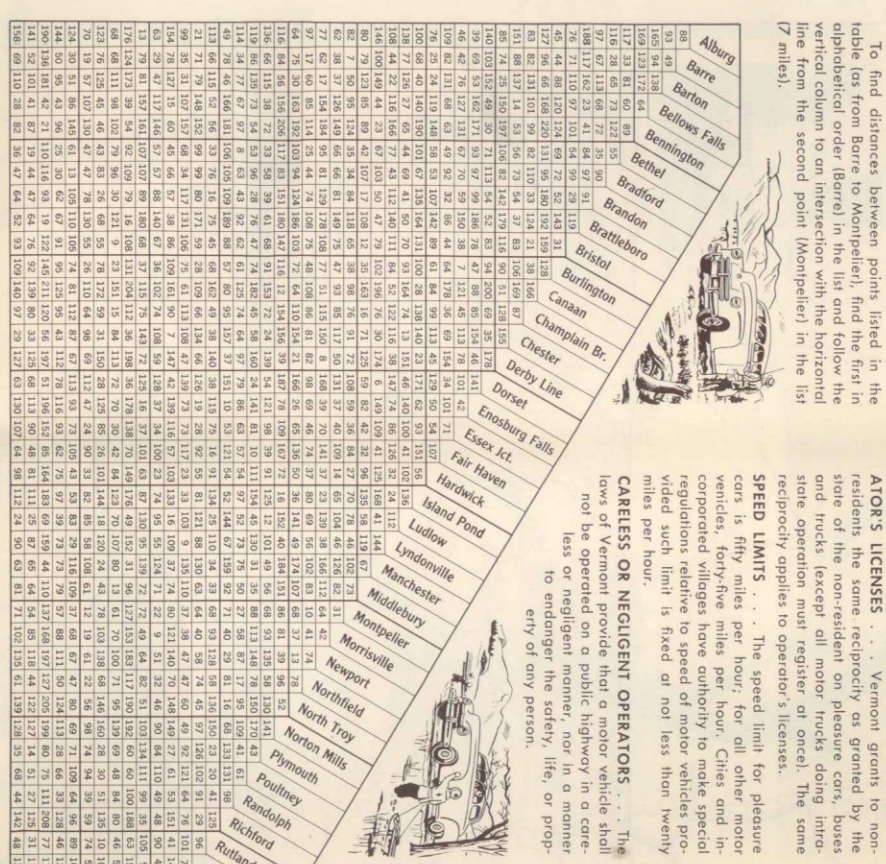


TABLE OF APPROXIMATE DISTANCES

To find distances between points listed in the table (as from Barre to Montpelier), find the first in alphabetical order (Barre) in the list and follow the vertical column to an intersection with the horizontal line from the second point (Montpelier) in the list (7 miles).

RECIPROCITY ON REGISTRATION AND OPERATOR'S LICENSES

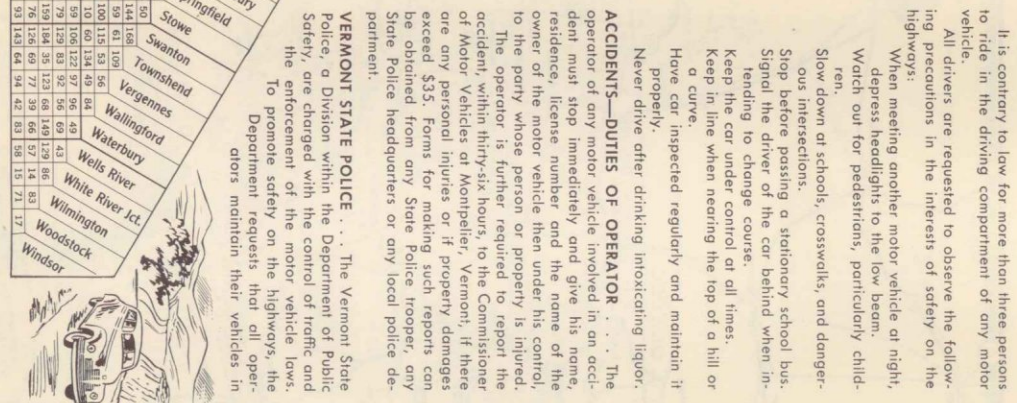
Vermont grants to non-residents the same reciprocity as granted by the state of the non-resident on pleasure cars, buses and trucks (except all motor trucks doing intra-state operation must register at once). The same reciprocity applies to operator's licenses.

SPEED LIMITS

The speed limit for pleasure cars is fifty miles per hour; for all other motor vehicles, forty-five miles per hour. Cities and incorporated villages have authority to make special regulations relative to speed of motor vehicles provided such limit is fixed at not less than twenty miles per hour.

CARELESS OR NEGLIGENT OPERATORS

The laws of Vermont provide that a motor vehicle shall not be operated on a public highway in a careless or negligent manner, nor in a manner to endanger the safety, life, or property of any person.



It is contrary to law for more than three persons to ride in the driving compartment of any motor vehicle. All drivers are requested to observe the following precautions in the interests of safety on the highways: When meeting another motor vehicle at night, depress headlights to the low beam. Watch out for pedestrians, particularly children. Slow down at schools, crosswalks, and dangerous intersections. Stop before passing a stationary school bus. Signal the driver of the car behind when intending to change course. Keep the car under control at all times. Keep in line when nearing the top of a hill or a curve. Have car inspected regularly and maintain it properly. Never drive after drinking intoxicating liquor.

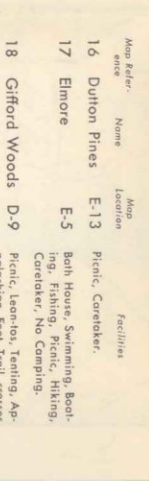
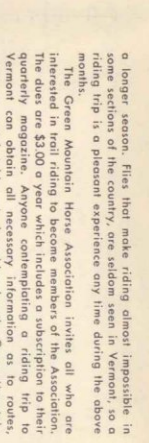
ACCIDENTS—DUTIES OF OPERATOR . . . The operator of any motor vehicle involved in an accident must stop immediately and give his name, residence, license number and the name of the owner of the motor vehicle then under his control, to the party whose person or property is injured. The operator is further required to report the accident, within thirty-six hours, to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles at Montpelier, Vermont; if there are any personal injuries or if property damages exceed \$35. Forms for making such reports can be obtained from any State Police trooper, any State Police headquarters or any local police department.

VERMONT STATE POLICE . . . The Vermont State Police, a Division within the Department of Public Safety, are charged with the control of traffic and the enforcement of the motor vehicle laws. To promote safety on the highways, the Department requests that all operators maintain their vehicles in proper condition.

From one of Vermont to the other the Long Trail follows the skyline of a two hundred mile mountain range, dipping into valleys, climbing over summits, passing through forests, sometimes skirting lakes and ponds. Approach trails lead up to the Long Trail from nearby highways, and in addition there are highways which cross the Trail itself.

FISH AND GAME



FISH . . . Open Seasons

Trout—Brook, Brown, Lake, Landlocked, Golden Trout, Splined and landlocked Salmon—May 1 to Aug. 31 (incl.). Pike—May 1 to Nov. 14 (incl.). Bass—July 1 to Nov. 30 (incl.). (See Vermont laws for exceptions to the above applying to: Poconaug Pond and Horsey's Lake in Colchester County; Forest, Big Averill, Little Averill, Wells, Norton, and Moulden lakes in Essex County; Willoughby Lake, Seymour Lake, Shore Lake in Orleans County; Willoughby Lake and Parker Pond in Orleans County; Chittenden Lake in Rutland County; and Lake Champlain.)

FISH . . . Legal Lengths and Daily Limits

Trout—Brook, Brown, Lake, Golden, Splined (see Vermont laws for exceptions on Burton and Willoughby Rivers). Rainbow, Graveling and Black Splined—no less than 6 inches in length; not more than 5 pounds or more than 20 fish. Lake Trout and landlocked Salmon—no less than 15 inches; limit 2 fish either trout or salmon or one of each, or more than 10 pounds. Black Bass—no less than 10 inches in length and not more than 3 fish (7 fish in Lake Champlain). Pike—no less than 12 inches in length or more than 25 pounds. Perch—no less than 12 inches in length or more than 25 pounds.

GAME . . . Open Seasons

Deer—one deer with horns not less than three inches long, between Nov. 13 and Nov. 25 (both dates inclusive). Rabbits or Hares—Oct. 1-Feb. 29 (incl.). Grey Squirrels—Oct. 1-Oct. 31 (incl.). Cottontail Rabbits—not protected, except in Chittenden and Bennington Counties (see Vermont laws). Moose, Caribou, Elk—protected at all times.

GAME BIRDS . . . Open Seasons

Ruffed Grouse (Partridge)—Oct. 1-Oct. 31 (incl.). Woodcock, Duck—Regulated by U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Pheasant—Venezky and Sunday during month of October; 2 cock birds per day, 4 for season.

BRIDE PATHS

The roads used for these so-called bride paths are the dirt roads which run throughout the entire State, generally higher in the hills than the main highways. They are soft surfaced, shoddy, always beautiful and very seldom used by motor cars. At present there are many miles of them marked, with stops arranged every ten to twenty miles for the riders' convenience for luncheon or over night.
