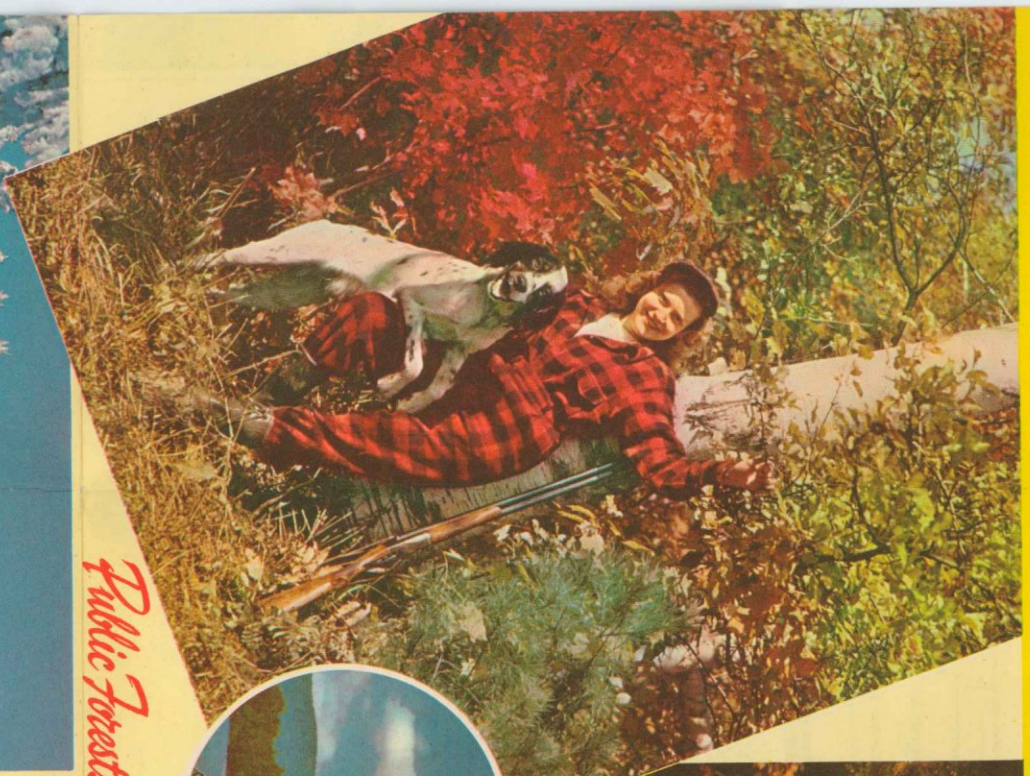

- 15 GIFFORD WOODS P-4 Picnic, Lean-tos, Tenting, Appalachian Foot Trail crosses Park, Caretaker.
- 16 JAMAICA R-5 Picnic, Bathing (undeveloped).
- 17 MONROE M-4 Hiking, Bird Sanctuary (undeveloped).
- 18 MT. PHILLO M-3 Picnic, Tenting, Paved Road to Summit, Scenic Views, Foot Trails, Caretaker.
- 19 ST. ALBANS BAY K-3 Bath House, Swimming, Beach, Picnic, Caretaker.
- 20 SAND BAR L-3 Bath House, Swimming, Boating, Picnic, Tenting, Fishing, Caretaker.

All state forest and forest park areas have fireplaces, good water, tables and sanitary facilities. For further information and illustrated folder, write the Vermont Forest Service, Montpelier, Vermont. FEES—Service and Maintenance fees at Ascutney and Darling State Forest Parks—50 cents—all other state forests and forest parks—25 cents per day per car of five persons or less. Camp Sites—tent floors, trailers—75 cents; lean-tos—\$1.00 per day per car of five persons or less.

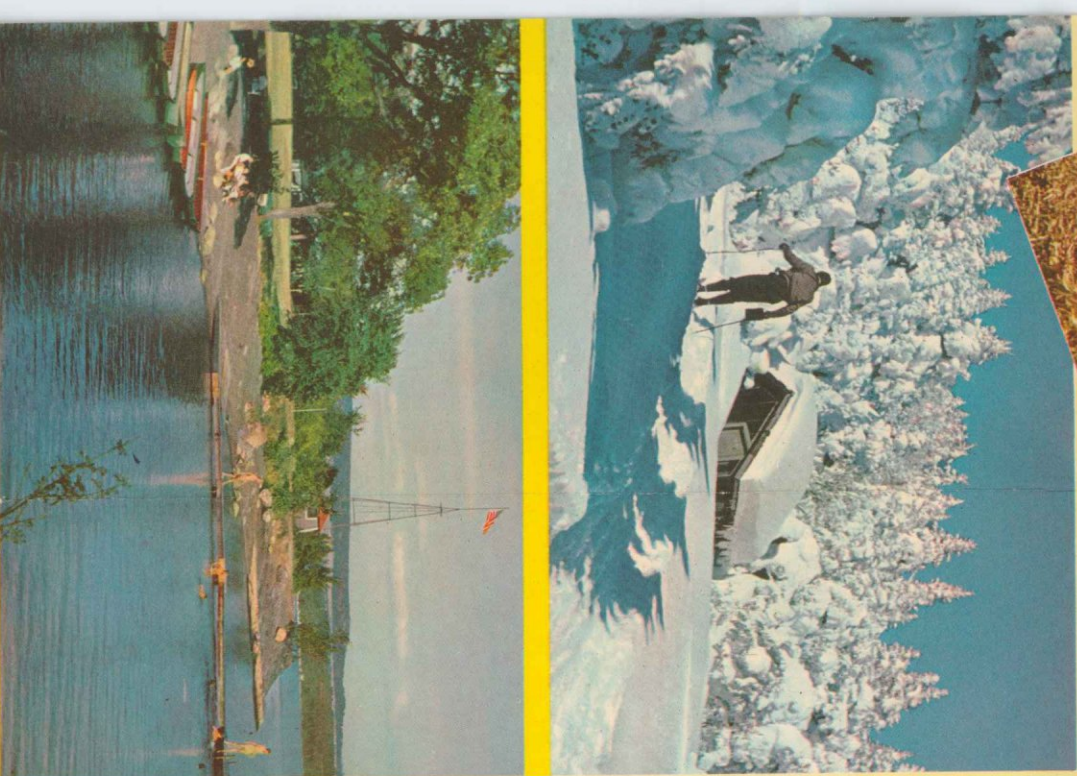
BATH HOUSE LOCKERS—10 cents per person.
