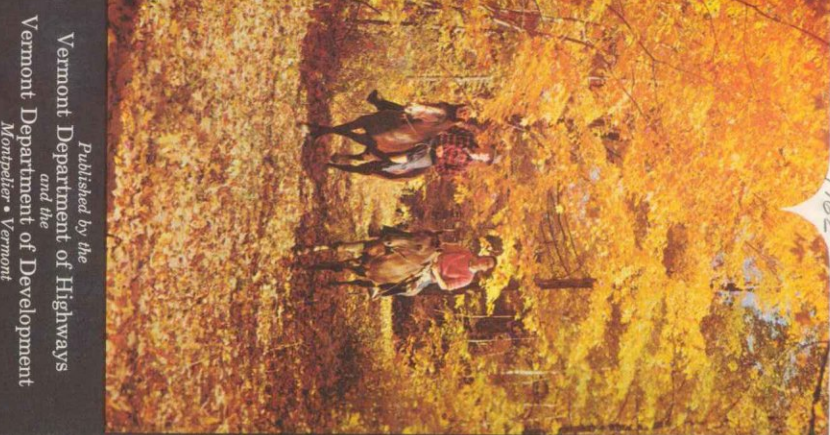
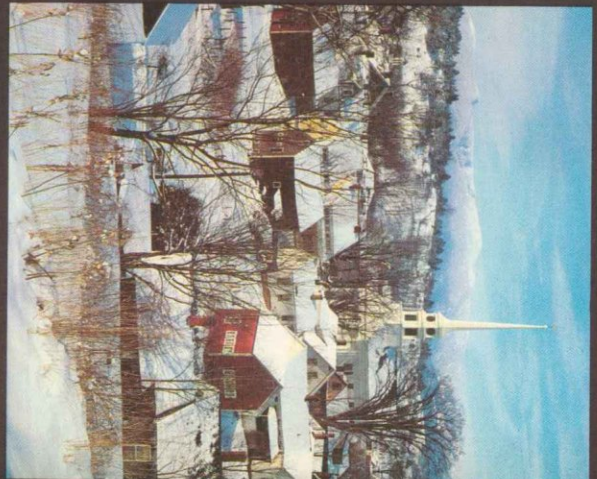
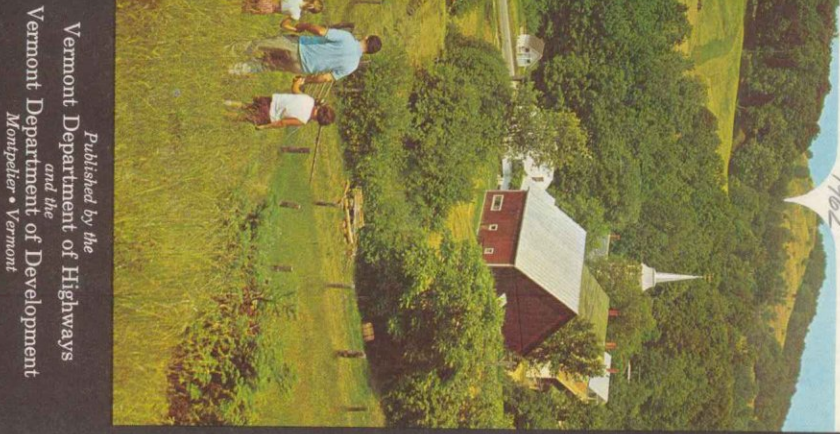

WINTER

Far from being severe, winters in Vermont are comfortable and exhilarating. Below zero cold snaps are brief and greatly tempered by the low humidity of a non-coastal state. Immaculate white landscapes, snow-covered villages and gleaming ski slopes are always within easy reach. Road plowing and sanding is superior to most states.



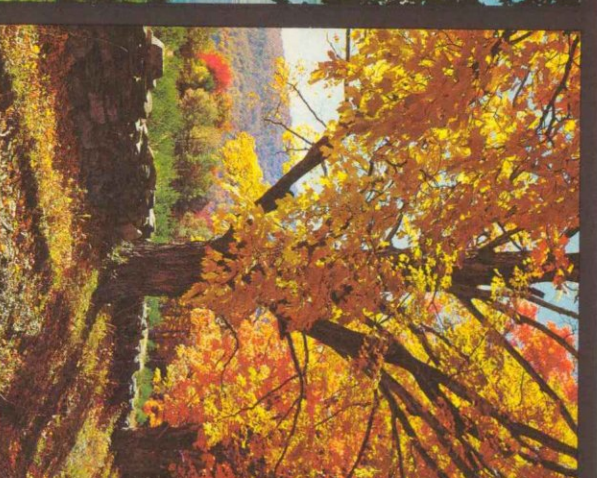
SPRING

Spring in Vermont arrives gently, with first thaws ushering in the sprouting season. Next, tender green shoots on vulnerable elm and maple appear. Early May opens the fishing season and pink and white apple blossoms burst forth exuberantly in mid-May. In June, corn mellowers and lilacs and the smell of red-brown earth turned by the plow.



SUMMER

Lushly green and gay with visitors, Vermont hums with life and activity all the long summer months. Green hills and cool mountain lakes beckon. Well-paved roads wind invitingly toward sun-drenched horizons. Worlds of lovely things to see, such as stone walls in upland pastures, or the sun setting across some still, blue pond.



FALL

Fall, the twilight of the year, but ablaze with color in Vermont. Shades of yellows, oranges and purples replace the greens of summer. The foliage is at its peak, and the weather is perfect for a variety of outdoor activities. The Vermont landscape glows briefly but radiantly.



Fishing

Over 400 Vermont lakes and ponds, countless mountain brooks and streams, Lake Champlain, and the Connecticut River offer challenging sport to the angler during all four seasons. Trout, bass, brook trout, and smallmouth bass are the most popular. Lake fishing for bass, lake and pickerel is best in midsummer and fall. Fall is ideal for fly-fishing for trout and salmon. Ask for fishing maps and information for popular lakes for fishing.

Water Sports

On the larger Vermont lakes are many first-class resorts for swimming, water skiing, canoeing, and fishing. Wooded shores of even the smallest ponds are privately owned. By week or season, ask for rental facilities. Canoeing is the most popular water sport in Vermont. Ask for boat launching sites. Ask for maps of boat-launching sites.

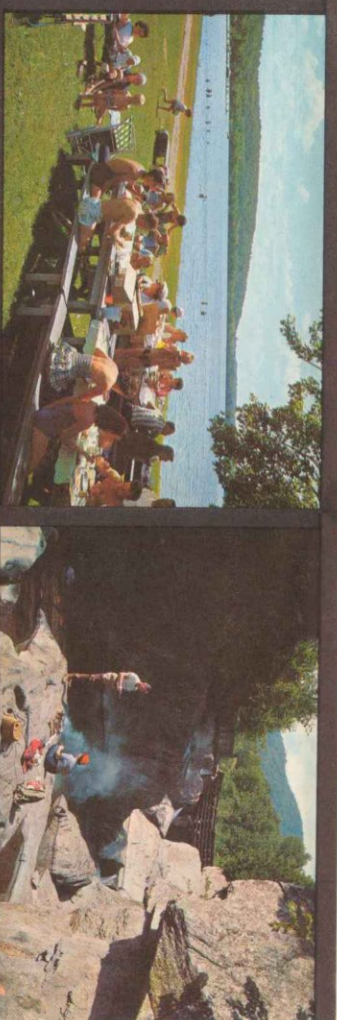
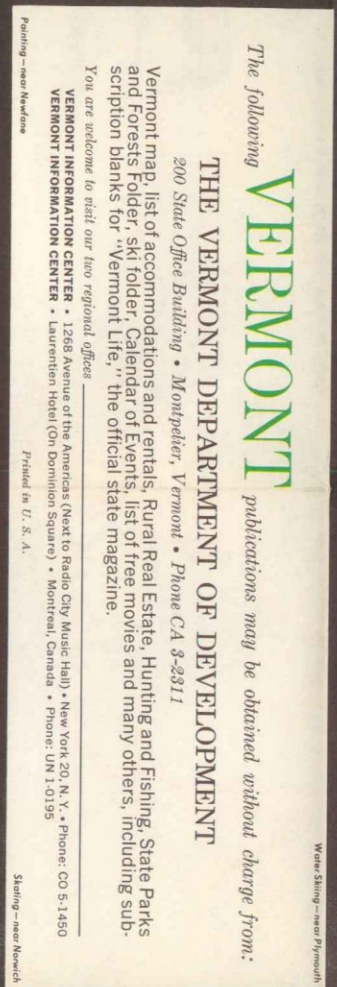
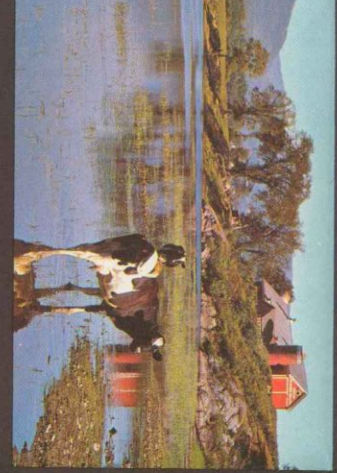
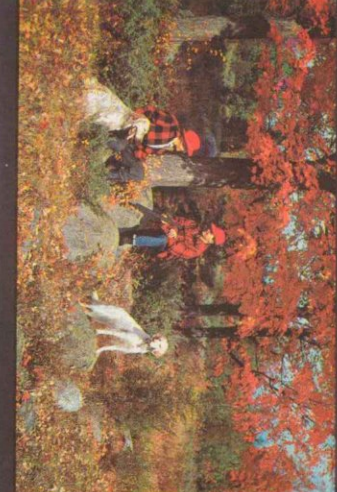


Hunting

Annual deer season in Vermont is over 10,000. A one-week hunting season precedes the regular deer-hunting season in November. In the fall, bird hunters may bag-cried grouse and quail. In the spring, hunters may bag-cried grouse and quail. Ask for hunting maps and information for popular hunting areas. Ask for information on hunting regulations.

Maple Sugar and Syrup

Maple syrup and sugar production is Vermont's most distinctive agricultural enterprise. It leads all states in volume of production. Vermont's maple syrup is produced from the sap of the maple tree. The sap is collected from the tree and then boiled down to produce maple syrup. Ask for information on maple syrup production.

Vermont is pre-eminently a dairy state, yet well suited to diversified farming and fruit growing. Vermont far exceeds any other New England state in the number of dairy animals owned. Dairy products are the backbone of the Vermont economy. Ask for information on dairy products.

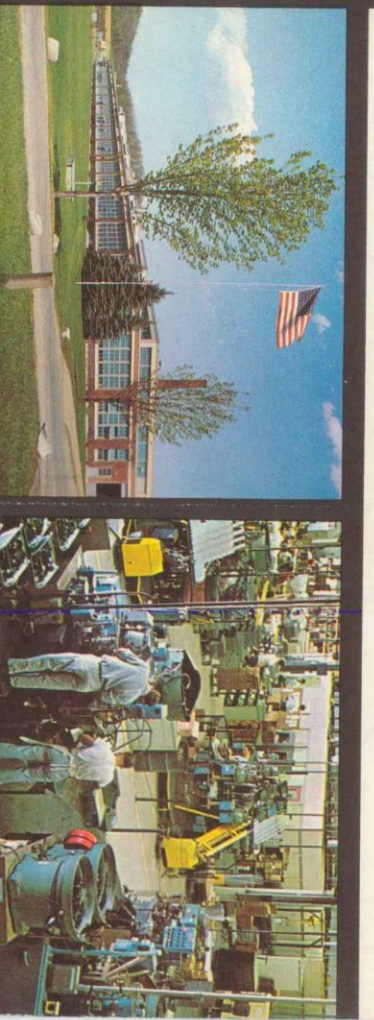
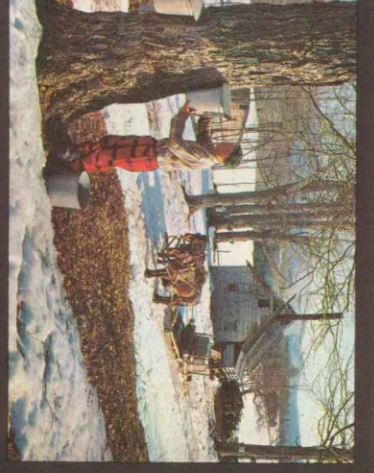
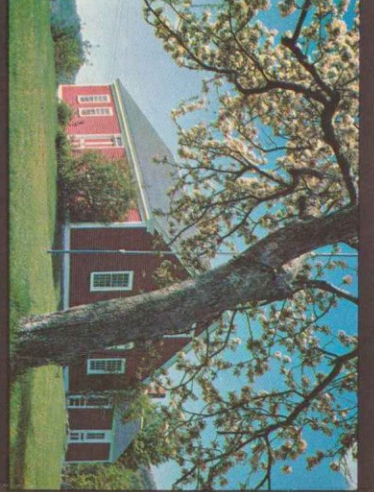
